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## Protocol for the conduct of outdoor athletics competitions – 5.6.2021

### Entry to Slovenia from countries on the Red List

Countries at high risk of SARS-CoV-2 infection, or administrative units of countries, are included on the Red List. The list of countries included on the Red list can be found:

A person coming from a country on the red list shall be quarantined for ten (10) days for possible infection with SARS-CoV-2.

However, a person will not be quarantined if he/she presents the following at the time of crossing the border:

- proof of a negative PCR test result for SARS-CoV-2 virus, not older than 48 hours from the time of swabbing. A PCR test shall be eligible if it is carried out in the Member States of the European Union, the Member States of the Schengen area, Australia, Israel, Canada, New Zealand, Russia, Serbia, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland or the United States of America, and at checkpoints on air routes for international air traffic, if it is carried out in Turkey; the PCR test shall be eligible if it is carried out in the Member States of the European Union, the Member States of the Schengen area, Australia, Israel, Canada, New Zealand, Russia, Serbia, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland or the United States of America.
- proof of a negative HAG test result for SARS-CoV-2 virus, not older than 48 hours from the time of swabbing. The HAG test is valid if it is carried out in the Member States of the European Union, the Member States of the Schengen area, Australia, Israel, Canada, New Zealand, Russia, Serbia, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland or the United States of America and, at checkpoints on air routes for international air traffic, if it is also carried out in Turkey, and is also listed in the [Common List of Rapid Antigen Tests](#) (Annex 1, ANNEX I: Common list of rapid antigen tests). HAG tests from all manufacturers on the list are valid, regardless of whether they are marked yellow or white.
- proof of a positive PCR test result that is more than 10 days old, unless otherwise judged by a medical practitioner, but not more than six months old, or a doctor's certificate that she has recovered from COVID-19 and that it has not been more than six months since the onset of symptoms; or either (a) a certificate from a medical practitioner that she has recovered from COVID-19 and that it has not been more than six months since the onset of symptoms; or
- proof of vaccination against COVID-19 proving that it has been since receipt:
  - a second dose of Comirnaty vaccine from Biontech/Pfizer for at least seven days,
  - a second dose of COVID-19 Vaccine from Moderna at least 14 days,
  - the first dose of Vaxzevria (COVID-19 Vaccine) from AstraZeneca at least 21 days,
  - a dose of COVID-19 Vaccine Janssen by Johnson and Johnson/Janssen-Cilag for at least 14



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- days,
- the first dose of Covishield vaccine from Serum Institute of India/AstraZeneca for at least 21 days,
  - a second dose of Sputnik V vaccine manufactured by Russia's Gamaleya National Centre of Epidemiology and Microbiology at least 14 days previously,
  - a second dose of CoronaVac vaccine manufactured by Sinovac Biotech has been administered for at least 14 days; or
  - a second dose of COVID-19 Vaccine from Sinopharm at least 14 days.
- The evidence referred to in point 2 shall be taken into account if it was issued in a Member State of the European Union or the Schengen area, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the United States of America, Australia, New Zealand, Canada, Israel or Russia.

### **Organisation of the competition**

All attendees must show one of the following certificates before entering the event area:

- a certificate of a negative SARS-CoV-2 test result by polymerase chain reaction (PCR) or rapid antigen test (HAG test) not older than 72 hours;
- proof of vaccination against COVID-19, demonstrating that it has elapsed since receipt:
  - a second dose of Comirnaty vaccine from Biontech/Pfizer for at least seven days,
  - a second dose of COVID-19 Vaccine from Moderna at least 14 days,
  - the first dose of Vaxzevria (COVID-19 Vaccine) from AstraZeneca at least 21 days,
  - a dose of COVID-19 Vaccine Janssen by Johnson and Johnson/Janssen-Cilag for at least 14 days,
  - the first dose of Covishield vaccine from Serum Institute of India/AstraZeneca for at least 21 days,
  - a second dose of Sputnik V vaccine manufactured by Russia's Gamaleya National Centre of Epidemiology and Microbiology at least 14 days previously,
  - a second dose of CoronaVac vaccine manufactured by Sinovac Biotech has been administered for at least 14 days; or
  - a second dose of COVID-19 Vaccine from Sinopharm at least 14 days.
- proof of a positive PCR or HAG test result that is more than 21 days old but not more than six months old;
- a doctor's certificate that they have recovered from COVID-19 and that it has not been more than six months since the onset of symptoms.
- -proof that she has survived COVID-19 (proof referred to in points 1 or 2) and proof that she has been vaccinated with a single dose of Biontech/Pfizer or Moderna vaccine within a maximum period of eight months from the date of the positive PCR test result or the onset of symptoms, with protection being established from the date of vaccination; and (b) proof that she has been vaccinated with a single dose of Biontech/Pfizer or Moderna vaccine within a maximum period of eight months from the date of the positive PCR test result or the date of onset of symptoms.



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Only accredited trainers, other than competitors, are allowed in the event area. Each club shall announce in advance the number of coaches who will be present at the competition.

All attendees (athletes, coaches, officials and technical staff) are recommended to wear a protective mask if they are unable to ensure a safety distance. The exception is the athlete during warm-up and competition.

The secretariat of the competition must be organised in such a way that one representative of the club enters individually and makes all the necessary arrangements (payment, start list with technical instructions, start numbers). Entry is only allowed with a mask. The results are published by the Secretariat only on the notice board and on social networks. The surface area of the results board should be as large as possible. The start list is published electronically only.

The call room must be organised to have enough space (more than before). Only one group of competitors at a time shall be in the entry box. Especially in the entry hall, a distance of 2 m at the control must be observed. After the control, sufficient space must be provided for waiting to enter the competition area.

All officials shall, where necessary, remind the athletes to keep an appropriate distance between themselves.

Strict control should be exercised to ensure that only "accredited" persons are inside the competition areas and no one else.

Competitors should leave the competition area in the direction of not meeting incoming competitors.

### **Athletes**

The principle of arrive - perform - leave applies.

Athletes must be asked to observe their own socially adapted distribution, this also applies to referees and technical staff.

### **Technical disciplines**

Provide sufficient benches on the competition area for athletes to sit at an appropriate distance from each other. A tape measure should be provided at the crash marks so that athletes can measure their own run-up.

Trial jumps/throws shall be conducted according to the start list.



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## **Ceremonial**

The announcement of the winners shall be carried out according to a pre-arranged schedule. The ceremonial line going to the podium shall be stretched. The awarding officials shall congratulate the athlete by word of mouth only, no congratulations by hand, and the medal shall be handed to the athlete. Immediately afterwards, the athletes themselves put the medal around their necks.

## **Coaches**

A special enclosure is organised for the coaches at each event from where they can observe their athletes. Arrival should be organised. The space should be large enough to allow coaches to maintain a safety distance.
